- Facilitating collection of materials to nominate someone for the AMATYC Mathematics Excellence Award (as appropriate) – Fall of odd years

This would result in the following change to the current duties of the past-president:

• Past-president would no longer coordinate the Distinguished Service Award nominations






Each spring, OhioMATYC holds elections for new officers. This
